




WELCOME TO ROSCOMMON INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL







Director Statement: Colin Condon came to me with a simple, yet very personal, idea. The script was a page and a half, but it was full of heart, experience and self reflection. I felt compelled to help Colin bring his vision to the screen.

We shot over two days using just an iPhone, mounted on a dream grip with a rode video mic. I have been working this way for a couple of years, no crew, just me with a simple camera set up. It means I can travel light, move fast and create an intimate environment for actors to feel at ease and uninterrupted. We were delighted to have famed musician and filmmaker Myles O'Reilly lend us two tracks from his album Cocooning Heart for the film, they really capture the tone of what we were trying to do.

Couple with two subtle performance from Liam Burke and Stephen Maguire I feel we did a lot with very little. It was a delight to work on.




MONUMENTAL HEALING

Filmed during the pandemic, Laura Gallagher draws a parallel between past communal healing practices and modern challenges. Through intimate, handheld cinematography and the collaboration of artists Kate Murtagh Sheridan and Natalia Beylis, the film explores the significance of these forgotten structures and the traditional skills tied to their creation. A soundtrack - including a specially commissioned piece - enhances this reflective piece on community, landscape, and shared healing.




SHOWTIME



BLURRED LINES

Synopsis: When six close friends celebrate New Year's Eve together, secrets and conflicts reveal themselves after a drink gets spiked. As the accusations begin, the question's raised of who's really responsible? Who's consented?

This story focuses on the modern day stigmas of consent, stereotypes, inner turmoil, ideals and the challenges relationships face as we navigate our twenties.



Owing to time constraints, we're unable to present the winner of RIFF's Best International Feature Film but would like to take a page of this programme to tell you about it.

Synopsis: When bespoke becomes a label for optimized service, the human race is no longer content with customizing things; it begins to customize humans. One by one, the perfect service, the perfect children, the intricate global fertility chains, and the women therein fade out from the documentary footage, while director Jingjing steps into the spotlight from behind the camera. She becomes a Thai surrogate in captivity, but also a surrogacy agent who achieved upward social mobility; she turns into a selfless and hypocritical American surrogate mother – a product of technology born through surrogacy herself; she even tries to play an elite black lesbian at the very top of the feminist chain of contempt, only to collapse in on herself.

HONOURABLE MENTIONS

We were truly overwhelmed by the number of exceptional films submitted to this year's Roscommon International Film Festival. The sheer volume of outstanding entries made our selection process incredibly difficult. In fact, we received enough high-quality films to confidently fill a week-long festival. With only seven hours available, there were many remarkable films that we simply couldn't fit into the programme, and it's through no fault of their own that they weren't included.

We would like to take this section of the programme to give these films an honourable mention, as their creativity and storytelling are worthy of recognition. We highly recommend keeping an eye out for these films as they continue to make waves on the festival circuit.


